

WARNING SIGNS OF SUICIDE

- Increased use of alcohol or drugs
- Isolating from friends and family
- Lower productivity at work
- Giving away possessions
- Extreme mood swings
- Prolonged sadness, depression or anxiety
- Sleeping too much or too little
- Irritability or hostile behavior

1. CHECK IN: ASK HOW

THEY'RE FEELING

2. BE PRESENT: LISTEN

AND SHOW YOU CARE

3. OFFER HELP: CONNECT THEM WITH RESOURCES

4. FOLLOW UP: STAY IN TOUCH REGULARLY

IT IS WITH GREAT PLEASURE THAT I INTRODUCE **ERIC J. SOTO**, A DEDICATED 5TH PERIOD PLASTER TENDER APPRENTICE WITH OUR LOCAL. ERIC JOINED THE APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM IN 2023, INTRODUCED BY CLOSE FRIEND AND JOURNEYMAN PLASTER TENDER, FERNANDO CASTRO. WHAT INITIALLY DREW ERIC TO OUR TRADE WAS THE OPPORTUNITY TO BUILD A LONG-TERM, FULFILLING CAREER.

BEFORE ENTERING THE UNION, ERIC WORKED IN PAYROLL FOR AN INSULATION COMPANY AND PREVIOUSLY AS A CAR SALESMAN. HOWEVER, HIS DESIRE TO WORK HANDS-ON IN THE FIELD LED HIM TO PURSUE A NEW PATH. LIKE MANY OF OUR APPRENTICES, ERIC CAME INTO THE PROGRAM WITH NO PRIOR EXPERIENCE IN THE TRADE, YET HE HAS SHOWN IMPRESSIVE GROWTH, QUICKLY LEARNED THE SKILLS OF THE CRAFT AND DEMONSTRATED A STRONG EAGERNESS TO CONTINUE DEVELOPING PROFESSIONALLY.

WHEN ASKED WHERE HE ENVISIONS HIMSELF IN THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, ERIC EXPRESSED ASPIRATIONS OF BECOMING A FOREMAN, SUPERINTENDENT, OR EVEN A PROJECT MANAGER. HE DESCRIBES HIMSELF AS HIGHLY AMBITIOUS AND IS COMMITTED TO FURTHERING HIS EDUCATION AND TRAINING TO REACH THOSE GOALS.

AMONG THE MANY PROJECTS HE HAS WORKED ON, ERIC SAYS HE MOST ENJOYS LARGE-SCALE ASSIGNMENTS, PARTICULARLY AT COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES—WHERE HE'S BEEN INVOLVED IN THE ERECTING AND DISMANTLING OF EXTENSIVE SCAFFOLDING SYSTEMS. THESE COMPLEX PROJECTS HAVE FUELED HIS PASSION FOR THE WORK AND STRENGTHENED HIS TECHNICAL ABILITIES..

ERIC ALSO SHARED ADVICE FOR NEW APPRENTICES BE OPEN TO LEARNING EVERYTHING AND ANYTHING, REMAIN PATIENT, AND STAY CONSISTENT. HE CREDITS THE UNION FOR SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVING HIS LIFE, ESPECIALLY BY HELPING HIM ACHIEVE FINANCIAL STABILITY.

FROM A YOUNG AGE, JULIAN ACCOMPANIED HIS FATHER ON SIDE JOBS, GAINING HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE IN PLASTERING LONG BEFORE OFFICIALLY JOINING THE TRADE. THOUGH HE STRUGGLED ACADEMICALLY AND BARELY GRADUATED HIGH SCHOOL, JULIAN KNEW EARLY ON THAT CONTINUING FORMAL EDUCATION WAS NOT THE PATH FOR HIM. IN 2006, SHORTLY AFTER GRADUATION, HE JOINED LOCAL 1414 AS AN APPRENTICE—MARKING THE BEGINNING OF A LONG AND SUCCESSFUL CAREER.

WHILE JULIAN WAS WELL-VERSED IN PLASTERING THANKS TO HIS EARLY EXPERIENCES, FIREPROOFING WAS NEW TERRITORY. 
LOCAL UNION 1414 JOURNEYMAN & FOREMAN, CASTON INC.

HE ENCOURAGES THEM TO FOCUS ON THEIR OWN TASKS, REMAIN EAGER TO LEARN, AND VIEW EVERY OPPORTUNITY TO HELP AS AN INVESTMENT IN THEIR FUTURE—A COMMITMENT THAT ALWAYS PAYS OFF.
