Local Union 1414 is proud to highlight one of our newest members, Gerardo Cervantes, a second-stage plaster tender apprentice who joined our union earlier this year. Gerardo first learned about Local 1414 through a friend, and he was immediately drawn to the rewards and opportunities our union provides.

Before joining, Gerardo worked in carpentry but had never been part of a union. He says he is grateful for the guidance he's received throughout his apprenticeship so far. He especially appreciated the OSHA class, noting that safety and getting home at the end of the day are his top priorities. Gerardo enjoys learning new skills and takes pride in applying what he learns on the jobsite.

When asked about the most challenging part of the trade so far, he didn't hesitate to say that working in the desert heat during the summer has been tough — but he pushed through it. He understands that he is just at the beginning of his career, but in five years he sees himself as a knowledgeable journeyman with a strong foundation in the trade.

Gerardo also shared that he looks forward to retirement in about 25 years, appreciating that this career path offers the rare opportunity to retire before age 50 — a benefit not many jobs provide, especially at just 22 years old.

When asked whether he would recommend joining the union, Gerardo said he absolutely would. He acknowledges that it is a demanding trade, but one that will pay off in the long run. His advice to new members is to learn as much as possible, stay focused, and recognize how valuable this opportunity truly is. He emphasized the excellent benefits and stability the union provides.

Aurelio's union journey began in 1998 when a friend introduced him to the benefits and opportunities that come with being a union worker. Before joining, Aurelio had already built about four years of scaffolding experience with a non-union company. Since transitioning into the union, he has remained committed to the trade, gaining stability, great benefits, and steady work. Aurelio says that feeling valued in his job has given him peace of mind and supported both his personal and professional growth.

When Aurelio first entered the union, there was no apprenticeship program for his trade. Seeing the strong apprenticeship program in place today, he believes new apprentices now have a tremendous advantage—structured training, a deeper understanding of the trade, and the preparation needed to excel as journeymen.



Advice for New Apprentices

When asked to share guidance for those entering the apprenticeship program, Aurelio offered powerful words:

"Take the job seriously from day one. Be responsible, show up on time, always be willing to learn, and don't turn down work. Every task—big or small—is an opportunity to gain experience and prove yourself. Stay open to challenges, be humble enough to ask questions, keep a positive attitude, listen to your journeymen and learn from their experience. Work safely and take pride in everything you do. The effort you put in now will shape your future in the trade."

Over his many years in the trade, Aurelio has worked on countless projects throughout Southern California. Among the most memorable, he highlights:


